School Aims

Admissions

Our priority criteria are as follows:-

- Children who have successfully completed our Pre Prep have first priority in the main preparatory school.
- Siblings – there is no automatic entry until completion of an assessment day.
- Children from the waiting list who have attended the PrePrep. Maldon Court Preparatory School will not discriminate on admissions. It promotes the principle and practice of equal opportunities for all pupils regardless of religion, ethnic and social background. Children are valued for their own intrinsic worth and encouraged to achieve their own individual potential.

Assessment Day In Class

The Assessment Day will be as follows:

- A) Day in class with assessments in Literacy and Numeracy.
- B) Informal Interview with the Head or Deputy Headteacher.
- C) Feedback to Headteacher re: Assessments, from class teacher, Head of English and Head of Maths.
- D) Interview with Parents.

If the school can meet the child's educational needs then a place would be offered.

A formal offer of a place will not be given, unless a satisfactory assessment has taken place. If the assessment has not been satisfactory another assessment opportunity may be offered, but should

Parents must realise that an Assessment Day does not mean that a place is already secure.

A place will only be offered by the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher in writing.
